VOLUNTEERS NEED FOR MANSFIELD'S FESTIVAL ON THE GREEN DEMO

Greetings!

The barony will be participating at the town of Mansfield's Festival on the Green, a community sidewalk fair which will be held from Noon to 5pm on Sunday, September 13, 2009. The location of the Festival is the set of parking lots on Storrs Road / Rt. 195 behind Storrs Commons and the Marketplace (Store 24) buildings, across the street from the E.O. Smith High School (located right next to the UConn Storrs campus).

We've told the Festival that we will be offering games and crafts of the Middle Ages. The current plan is to teach kids and adults how to make a Viking-style whipcord that they can take home (very easy!) and to play the Food Game (have people guess which foods were available in the "Old World" during the Middle Ages, and which foods are "New World" imports). Volunteers are needed to help run these activities, or to provide demonstrations of other crafts for the public.

We will not have the space for a fighting demo, but if there are any fighters in the barony who own a mail shirt or helm that they are willing to lend for the day, please contact me. I've been informed that we will be in the children's area, so I expect that most of our interactions will be with families.

If you are willing to help, please contact me at muirnesue@aol. com ASAP and I will send you directions, our booth location, and information about where to park. Right now, I have one confirmed volunteer (thanks Maggie!) so more help would be greatly appreciated.

Demo Logistics

-The Festival is free, open to the public, and runs from Noon to 5pm. Our booth must be staffed at all times.

-Set up begins at 9am. All vendor vehicles must be removed from the site by 11am. Once the Festival is over, we must clean up and be off site by 6pm.

-The barony will have a 10'x10' space for our use. We must provide our tables, chairs, etc. I will be bringing a 10'x10' popup and at least one table. I recommend that you bring a chair. Please contact me about any table space you may need. Storrs Road / Rt. 195 will be closed from 11:30am until

12:30pm to accommodate the Mansfield Parade. Please plan to arrive before or after this time period.

-This is a low waste / Green event – all trash must be disposed of in the proper trash, recycling, or composting containers at the site. The organizers also urge vendors (like us) to keep their handouts to a minimum - i.e., use sign-up sheets or business cards rather than large fliers that will contribute to the amount of trash being generated. 

Barony Beyond the Mountain – Meeting Notes for 7/20/09.

There were 14 in attendance at the meeting held at the Metropolitan District of Hartford Training Center, Hartford, CT. A lot of folks are packing for Pennsic, thus attendance low and we kept things to the really important items and reports from those actually at the meeting.

Officer Reports:

Exchequer: Larry reported that Suzanne gave him the remaining information she had from the old account. The cost for printing the new checks will likely be in the next bank statement. He had just received a \$25 check for Ravenhill's contribution to the Baronial dag. It replaces an earlier lost check. He has not seen any copies of exchequer reports from the Cantons. He would like to be copied on them.

Reminder: Andrea (Baroness Aelfgifa) thought we should also add to our Baronial policies a provision for an informal annual review of our financial records within the Barony at mid-year by two independent, non-signatory members. – Comments from the populace are welcome. We will revisit this in September.

Chatelaine: Andris, who will be stepping up to replace Eilidth in August, asked for and received permission to participate in a Gold Key garb swap to get more of the sizes that we have too little of.

Archery: Practices continue to happen at Bozrah. Also, we have a new archery practice site at the home of Dorigen and Eloise (Bob and Kris) in Burlington, CT (very near the Bristol city line).

EVENTS - Baronial: The Barony is holding a Picnic/Schmooze event at Wickham Park on Saturday 8/22/09. We have reserved two (2) side-by-side groves, which have space to erect small shelters and a couple grills. Mistress Elizabeth is head autocrat. The park will charge \$5 per car to enter the park and we will charge a site fee to cover the rental of the park. More information will be in the Chanticleer and on our website. The Fall Feast of Simple Fare will take place on 11/7/09 at the same site, the South United Methodist Church in Manchester, CT. We have been penciled onto their calendar. Carol proposed a Demo opportunity. The Town of Mansfield, CT is holding their 6th annual Festival on the Green. It will be held on Sunday 9/13/09. We decided to go with it. People willing to demonstrate their arts or crafts are heartily encouraged to attend. We may also pass out information about Simple Fare and possibly Yule.
