

10/31/17 - X-RAYS REVEAL SKETCH OF MARY QUEEN OF SCOTS - LONDON, ENGLAND—X-rav imaging has revealed a rare portrait of Mary Queen of Scots underneath a painting of a Scottish nobleman, according to a report in The Independent. The unfinished image is thought to have been started in 1586 by Dutch artist Adrian Vanson in Scotland, while Mary was a prisoner in England, and may have been abandoned when she was executed for her complicity in a plot to murder Queen Elizabeth I later that year. The sketch of Mary's face, hat, and neck were eventually covered with the image of Sir John Maitland, the Scottish king's Chancellor, in 1588. Part of Mary's dress was turned into his doublet, and her right hand was modified to form Maitland's right hand. "Now that we know from the X-ray images what was going on, it explains why the portrait of the Scottish Chancellor was so awkwardly painted," said Caroline Rae of the Courtauld Institute of Art. ## 10/25/17 - NEW THOUGHTS ON ENGLAND'S MEDIEVAL LEPROSY EPIDEMIC -

CAMBRIDGE, ENGLAND—Sarah Inskip of the University of Cambridge says that red squirrel pelts and meat traded by the Vikings of Denmark and Sweden could have introduced leprosy to southeastern England, according to a BBC News report. A strain of the incurable disease, which has also been found in medieval Scandinavian skeletons, was discovered in a medieval woman's skull dating to between A.D. 885 and 1015. The victim lived in the East of England. where squirrel products probably came into the country through the ports at Kings Lynn and Yarmouth. Inskip suggests the disease became endemic in the East of England earlier than in other parts of the country, requiring the construction of the island's first leper hospitals in the eleventh century A.D. ## 10/24/17 - ASTROLABE RECOVERED FROM PORTUGUESE SHIPWRECK - COVENTRY,

ENGLAND—According to a BBC News report, an astrolabe dating to between 1495 and 1500 has been recovered from a shipwreck in the Indian Ocean, off the coast of Oman. Mariners used such navigational instruments to measure the altitude of the sun. This astrolabe was recovered from the Esmeralda, part of a Portuguese fleet led by explorer Vasco da Gama, who was the first person to sail directly from Europe to India. Laser scanning of the instrument, conducted by researchers at the University of Warwick, revealed navigation markings. David Mearns of Blue Water Recovery said the instrument had to have been made before 1502, when the ship left Lisbon. It also bears a Portuguese coat of arms, and the personal emblem of Don Manuel I, who became King of Portugal in

## 10/17/17 - POSSIBLE MISSING JEWELRY BOX PIECE FOUND AT VIKING FORTRESS -KØGE.

DENMARK—A small silver artifact has been uncovered at Borgring, a Viking fortress in eastern Denmark. According to a report in Science Nordic, the object resembles one of the three parts known to be missing from an elaborate box brooch discovered in a Viking woman's grave at the Fyrkat fortress in Hobro, which is located to the north of Borgring. "It will be incredible if this fitting is connected with the find from Fyrkat," said Jeanette Varberg of the Moesgaard Museum. "If this really is where it comes from then it's like finding a needle in the ocean." The woman in the grave at Fyrkat is thought to have been a high-status shaman or sorceress. Analysis of her "well-used and highly treasured" box suggests it held white lead, which appears to have been used as a sealant to waterproof the box. Perhaps she traveled between the two castles, which are both thought to have been built by Harald Bluetooth, who was king of Denmark between A.D. 958 and 987. Analysis of the metal could offer more information on the origins of the two pieces. For more, go to "Bluetooth's Fortress."

10/12/17 - ARABIC WORDS DETECTED IN VIKING SILK GARMENTS - UPPSALA, SWEDEN—According to a report in BBC News, textile archaeologist Annika Larsson of Uppsala University found Arabic words woven into tiny geometric designs on garments made from imported silk recovered from Viking graves in Birka and Gamla Uppsala more than 100 years ago.

Larsson said she had not previously encountered designs similar to the ones embroidered on the garments in Sweden. "I couldn't quite make sense of them and then I remembered where I had seen similar designs—in Spain, on Moorish textiles." she recalled. Looking at the designs under magnification and at different angles, Larsson spotted the word "Ali," the name of the fourth caliph of Islam and cousin and son-in-law of the Prophet Muhammad, written in Arabic Kufic script, along with the word "Allah," written in mirrored lettering, in at least 10 of the 100 pieces of clothing she has examined. Islamic ideas of an afterlife may have influenced Viking-age burial customs, Larsson explained, though "the possibility that some of those in the graves were Muslim cannot be completely ruled out," she said. Scientists will now try to establish the origins of the people who were buried in the graves. ## 10/3/17 - NORSE MEETING PLACE INVESTIGATED IN SCOTLAND - THURSO.

SCOTLAND—A geophysical survey may have detected evidence of a medieval Norse parliament meeting place in the Scottish Highlands, according to a report from BBC News. The survey of Thing's Va Broch, which was carried out by researchers from the Orkney Research Center for Archaeology, the University of the Highlands and Islands Archaeology Institute, and the Caithness Broch Project, detected "faint features" that may relate to activity associated with the meetings. Thing's Va, which is the site of an Iron Age broch, or stone-built roundhouse, derives its name from "ting," the Norse word for meeting place. Archaeologists will undertake exploratory excavations this month to try

### 10/2/17 - ARCHAEOLOGISTS INVESTIGATE SITE OF THE BATTLE OF GRUNWALD -

GRUNWALD, POLAND—Archaeologists and metal detectorists joined forces to look for traces of the Battle of Grunwald, fought on July 15, 1410, according to a report in Science & Scholarship in Poland. On that day, the Kingdom of Poland and the Grand Duchy of Lithuania defeated the German-Prussian Teutonic Knights in what is remembered as one of the largest battles in medieval Europe. Szymon Drej of the Battle of Grunwald Museum said the team recovered about 300 artifacts, including arrowheads. Prussian spearheads, and a seal bearing a Christian image of a pelican feeding blood to chicks in a nest. The seal, thought to be connected to a chapel that later stood on the battlefield, resembles one found in the courtyard of Malbork, a castle built by the Teutonic Knights in what is now northern Poland. After the battle, Polish and Lithuanian forces laid siege to the Malbork Castle in an attempt to crush Prussia. But the castle withstood the siege and the Teutonic Knights lost little territory in the Peace of Thorn of 1411. The researchers will continue to search the area for evidence of the battle.
