History in the News

An archaeology student finds 7 stunning Viking silver arm rings, Danish museum says | AP News

The find in Aarhus, Denmark has ties to Russia, Ukraine and the British Isles, says the Moesgaard museum. "The find emphasizes that Aarhus was a central hub in the Viking world," said Kasper H. Andersen a historian at Moesgaard. Estimates indicate that the rings date to 800 ce, and there is a variety of styles, from Scandinavia, and further south in Rus lands.

<u>Stonehenge Altar Stone</u> now identified to be from Scotland and not Wales as previously thought!

Oar Fish in California? More likely than you think! Clickbait? Perhaps! But these fish aren't often seen above depths of 200m. Their home depth is between 200 meters below the surface and 1000 meters in the Mesopelagic zone of the ocean¹, and while they have historically been considered omens of ill fortune when spotted on the surface, there is no evidence to suggest a correlation. However, it is still unknown why they are occasionally found at the surface.
